IVAN C MARQUES

Ivan C. Marques is the current Secretary for Multidimensional Security at the Organization of American States (OAS). He is an expert in Public Security and Human Rights. He is a lawyer; holds an MSc in International Affairs from the University of Campinas (Brazil), and another in Human Rights from the London School of Economics and Political Science (England).

In his professional life, he has collaborated with the public and private sectors working

on issues of institutional relations, strategic planning, citizen security, protection of human rights, and reduction of violence.

In his career, he contributed to the American Chamber of Commerce of Brazil, the Mayor's Office of São Paulo, the cabinet of the President of the Republic of Brazil, the Ministry of Human Rights of the Brazilian Federal government, and the Sou da Paz Institute, one of the pioneering civil society organizations in campaigns and policy proposals against armed violence in Brazil.

Most recently, he was a consultant to the United Nations and Executive Director of the international coalition International Action Network on Small Arms (IANSA).

Bolivar Tello Astudillo currently serves as General Director of the Integrated Security Service ECU 911, and Chair of the OAS Subsidiary Technical Group on Emergency and Security Systems.

As part of his experience within the SIS ECU 911, he was Deputy Technical Director of Operations.

He previously served as Chief of the Community Police of the Quito Metropolitan District and General Director of the Metropolitan Police of the Quito Metropolitan

District. He was Citizen Security Advisor at the Ministry of Security Coordination and Director of Control and Public Order at the Ministry of Government.

He has more than 25 years of experience in public safety. He has conducted research on citizen security, peaceful coexistence, public order, and public policy issues. The latter has led him to propose actions, strategies, and projects for the national and subnational governments.

He earned his Master's Degree in Public Policy Analysis and a Higher Diploma in Citizen Security at the Latin American Faculty of Social Sciences (FLACSO-ECUADOR).
