Celia Maritza Gomez Sanchez

Celia Maritza Gomez Sanchez is currently the Emergency Regulatory Specialist for the Integrated Security Service (ISS) ECU 911, responsible for the coordination of regulatory processes and for creating standards for the (ISS) ECU 911 at the national level.

She is responsible for project management technical-legal standards, related cross-cutting technical regulations, and the drafting of legal standards at primary, secondary and tertiary levels. Luis Fernando Viera Eguiguren

Luis Fernando Viera Eguiguren was elected President of Ecuador's National Federation of Deaf People (FENASEC, for its acronym in Spanish) in 2018, for the second time.

He was born in Shell, in the eastern part of Ecuador, and became a deaf community activist at a very young age. In 2000 he became President of the Ecuadorian National Federation of Deaf People for the first time. His work increased the visibility of the deaf community and their possibilities of exercising their rights.

He was the founder and vice president of Guayaquil's Deaf Community Association in 1995.

Throughout his career, Mr. Viera Eguiguren has dedicated all his efforts to the deaf community of Ecuador, becoming a well-recognized deaf leader in his country.



Monica Alexandra Nicolalde Muñoz

Monica Alexandra Nicolalde Muñoz is the National Director of Projects and Technological Innovation of the Integrated Security Service (ISS) ECU 911.

Previously, she served as the National Head of Infrastructure and Channels of the Bank of Ecuador's Social Security Institute (BIESS, for its acronym in Spanish).
